# **Certification and Approval of Import Aircraft and Related Products**

## **Countries With Which the United States Has Reciprocal Import-Export Agreements For Aeronautical Products**

The United States has concluded agreements for reciprocal recognition of certificates of airworthiness for imported aircraft and for the export and import of other aeronautical products. An aircraft, engine or propeller manufactured in the countries listed below are eligible for a CAA type certificate under the requirements of Part 10. As new agreements are concluded, this list will be revised.
