Certification basis	CAR 6, December 20, 1956, and Amendment 6-1 through 6-4. Type Certificate No. 1H14 issued May 2, 1961. Date of Application for Type Certificate May 7, 1960.
Production basis	None. Prior to certification of each aircraft, a FAA representative must perform a detailed inspection for workmanship, materials, and conformity with the approved technical data, and a check of flight characteristics.
Equipment:	The basic required equipment as prescribed in the applicable airworthiness regulations (see certificated basis) must be installed in the helicopter for certification. In addition, the following items of equipment are required: (a) FAA Approved Rotorcraft Flight Manual dated May 2, 1961.

NOTE 1. Current weight and balance report including list of equipment in certificated empty weight, and loading instructions when necessary, must be in each helicopter at the time of original certification and at all times thereafter except in the case of operators having an approved weight control system.

NOTE 2. The following placard must be displayed in front of and in clear view of the pilot:

"THIS HELICOPTER MUST BE OPERATED IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE OPERATING
LIMITATIONS SPECIFIED IN THE FAA APPROVED ROTORCRAFT FLIGHT MANUAL."

NOTE 3. Information essential to the proper maintenance of the helicopter is contained in the manufacturer's Maintenance Manual provided with each helicopter.

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
