Subject: Cancellation of Order 8100.14A, Interim Procedures for Working with the European Community on Airworthiness Certification and Continued Airworthiness – dated September 7, 2008.

This memorandum cancels Order 8100.14A, Interim Procedures for Working with the European Community on Airworthiness Certification and Continued Airworthiness – dated September 7, 2008.

Order 8100.14 was issued to provide interim policy and guidance on how to interact with the European Aviation Safety Agency (EASA) and the National Aviation Authorities of European Union (EU) Member States for the purposes of type, production, and airworthiness certification, and continued airworthiness of aeronautical products while the FAA was negotiating an international agreement with the EU.

This Order is considered obsolete now that the new U.S. / EU aviation safety agreement has entered in force. The Technical Implementation Procedures of the agreement provides procedures and guidance for our workforce when interacting with EASA. Continued reference to Order 8100.14A may result in confusion.

For the reasons mentioned above, we consider this order obsolete.
