Description of the Type Design Change: Fabrication of DART D119-696-011/-013 Cargo Mirrors in accordance with DART Aerospace USA, Inc., Master Document List, Document Number MDL-D119-696, Revision C, dated June 25, 2007, or later Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) approved revision; and installation of this system in accordance with Installation Instructions, DART Aerospace USA, Inc., Document Number IIN-D119-696, Revision A, dated December 11, 2001, or later FAA-approved revision. This modification must be maintained in accordance with Instructions for Continued Airworthiness (ICA), DART Aerospace USA, Inc., Document Number ICA-D119-696, Revision 0, dated December 11, 2001, or later FAA-accepted revision.

Limitations and Conditions: Approval of this change in type design applies to Agusta S.p.A. Model A119 and AW119 MKII rotorcraft only. This approval should not be extended to other rotorcraft of this model on which previously approved modifications are incorporated unless it is determined by the installer that the relationship between this change and any of those other previously approved modifications, including changes in type design, will introduce no adverse effect upon the airworthiness of that rotorcraft. When modified by this STC, the rotorcraft must be operated in accordance with DART Aerospace USA, Inc.'s FAA-approved Rotorcraft Flight Manual Supplement (RFMS), Revision A, dated December 10, 2001, or later FAA-approved revision. A copy of this certificate, RFMS, and the ICA must be maintained as part of the permanent records for the modified rotorcraft.

If the holder agrees to permit another person to use this certificate to alter the product, the holder shall give the other person written evidence of that permission.

This certificate and the supporting data which is the basis for approval shall remain in effect until surrendered, suspended, revoked, or a termination date is otherwise established by the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration.
