A copy of this Certificate and FAA Approved Rotorcraft Flight Manual Supplement shall be maintained as part of the modified helicopters' permanent records.

This certificate and the supporting data which is the basis for approval shall remain in effect until surrendered, suspended, revoked, or a termination date is otherwise established by the Administrator of the Federal Aviation Administration.
