Description of the Type Design Change: Remove standard Scott 3200 tail wheel and fork and replace with a Gar-Aero-32 tail wheel fork, 24 spacer, and a 4.00 x 4 6 ply tire in accordance with Gar-Aero 400x4 Tundra Tail Wheel Drawing Number 004, dated April 7, 1989.

Limitations and Conditions: Approval of this change in type design applies to the above model aircraft, Serial No. 28459 only. This approval should not be used unless the installer determines that the relationship between this change and any other previously incorporated approved modifications will introduce no adverse effect upon the airworthiness of this aircraft.
